MANAGER'S REPORT

FUND OBJECTIVE AND POLICY

What is the investment objective of the Fund?

The Fund aims to grow the value of investments over the long-term through investment in a diversified mix of Malaysian assets.

Has the Fund achieved its objective?

The Fund has achieved its objective of providing long-term investment returns.

What are the Fund investment policy and principal investment strategy?

The Fund aims to invest in a diversified portfolio of equities and fixed income investments. In line with its objective, the investment policy and strategy will be to maintain a balanced portfolio between equities and fixed income investments in the ratio of 70:30. The fixed income portion of the Fund is to provide some capital stability to the Fund whilst the equity portion will provide the added return in a rising market. The investments by the Fund in equity securities shall be between 50% to 70% (both inclusive) of its Net Asset Value ("NAV") and investments in fixed income securities and liquid assets shall not be less than 30% of its NAV with a minimum credit rating of "BBB3" or "P2" by RAM Ratings ("RAM") or equivalent rating by Malaysian Rating Corporation Berhad ("MARC") or by local rating agency(ies) of the country of issuance or "BBB-" by Standard & Poor's ("S&P") or equivalent rating by any other international rating agencies. The Fund may invest up to 40% of its NAV in Unrated Fixed Income Securities. The Fund may opt to seek investment exposure via collective investment scheme that is in line with the Fund's objective, subject to the requirement of the Guidelines on Unit Trust Fund issued by the Securities Commission ("GUTF"). With effect from 10 July 2023, the Fund may invest up to 25% of its NAV in any Eligible Market globally with some operations or businesses in Malaysia to capture growth opportunities.

The asset allocation strategy for this Fund is as follows:

- the equity securities will be between 50% to 70% (both inclusive) of the Fund's NAV;
- investments in fixed income securities and liquid assets shall not be less than 30% of the Fund's NAV;
- up to 40% of the Fund's NAV may be in Unrated Fixed Income Securities; and
- at least 2% of the Fund's NAV in liquid assets

MARKET REVIEW (1 JANUARY 2023 TO 31 DECEMBER 2023)

Equity

The FBM100 Index rose 0.9% in Malaysian Ringgit (“MYR/RM”) terms during the financial period under review.

The FBM100 Index climbed 0.6% to 10,485 points in January 2023, underperforming the region, with North Asia especially China dominating Emerging Market (“EM”) fund flows. Globally, growth stocks outperformed, with technology stocks leading the pack as US inflation cooled further as well as optimism from China’s reopening. Gaming (+8%), Technology (+7%), REITs (+6%) and Building Materials (+6%) were among the biggest winners for the month, while Gloves (-7%), Plantations (-5%) and Healthcare (-4%) languished.

The FBM100 Index fell 2.0%, ending the month of February 2023 at 10,271 points. Investors remained cautious leading up to Budget 2023 while renewed concerns over the US Federation Reserves (the “Fed”) staying hawkish given persistent inflation coupled with encouraging consumption and employment data in the US recently further weighed on sentiment. The rebound in the US Dollar (“USD”) also took flows out of EM. Only Construction and Property sub-sectors posted modest gains during the month while Industrial (-7%), Technology (-6%) and Energy (-5%; DLG) were heavily beaten down.

The FBM100 Index fell 1.53% in March 2024. Weakness was in line with the sell-off in regional markets as investors aggressively risked off following the collapse of several high-profile banks in the US and Europe, potentially triggering a global liquidity squeeze, and mounting worries that US Fed’s aggressive tightening may have finally taken a toll on the US economy. Market however rebounded towards the later part of the month following Fed’s decision to go ahead with a 25 basis points (“bps”) hike, downplaying fears of a banking contagion and shifting attention back to inflation which has started to ease, albeit very gradually. Financials and Commodities were sold down in favor of defensive sectors such as Healthcare and Utilities during the month.

MARKET REVIEW (1 JANUARY 2023 TO 31 DECEMBER 2023) (CONTINUED)**Equity (continued)**

The FBM100 Index fell 0.33% in April 2023. Commodities, Telcos and Consumer Discretionary did well during the month, while Financials weakened further on lingering fear of a potential banking contagion. Recent economic data out of the US were mixed. We have a lower first quarter 2023 US Gross Domestic Products ("GDP") print of a mere 1%, down from 2.6% in fourth quarter of 2022, but that was mainly due to large inventory drawdowns. US consumer spending remains strong, up 3.7% over the same period (versus 1% in fourth quarter of 2022) on the back of low unemployment and solid wage gains. Consumer price Index ("CPI") cooled to 5% in March 2023, a lower-end of forecast, but core Personal consumption expenditures ("PCE") picked up from 3.5% in February 2023 to 3.6% in March 2023 no thanks to higher rents. All said, the Fed will likely go ahead with the 25 bps hike in the upcoming Federal Open Market Committee ("FOMC") meeting, and together with tighter credit conditions following recent collapse of several high-profile US banks, recession risk runs high.

The FBM100 Index fell 1.3% in May 2023. The sell-off was relatively broad-based, with select stocks within defensive sectors showing green, and we believe it was largely triggered by the recent weakness of the MYR/RM on the back of poor Chinese data and consequently the depreciation of the Yuan. Further aggravating the situation was the stronger US Dollar ("USD") due to concerns surrounding the US debt ceiling, and recent US data – encouraging payroll and wage, sticky inflation, and more recently a rebound in job openings - stoking bets on further rate hikes in the next FOMC meeting. The recently concluded first quarter of 2023 US earnings season saw 78% of companies beating analyst's earnings estimates by an aggregate of 6.5%.

The FBM100 Index fell 1.16% in June 2023. Investors remain wary of the sustained weakness of the MYR/RM, a rather uninspiring first quarter of 2023 corporate results although they were broadly in line, and domestic political uncertainties caused by the upcoming State elections. Expectations of a US recession have now been pushed back to 2024 given the still buoyant data points coming out of the US and consequently stoking bets of further rate hikes by the Fed in second half of 2023.

The FBM100 Index rose 5.0% in July 2023. Sentiment was sharply lifted by the slump in the USD, benefiting the MYR/RM, and waning expectations of a US recession following recent favorable economic data points – cooling inflation and still resilient jobs market. Gainers were broad-based, with mainly large-caps forging ahead.

The FBM100 Index was flat in August 2023 as the market took a pause following a dizzying rally the previous month. That said, we saw decent gains in Financials, Utilities and Materials. Within the broader market, we saw huge interest in Property, Construction and Transport. Sentiment was dampened by rebound in the USD and rising US Treasury ("UST") yields on expectations of further interest rate hikes in the US as economic data points remain strong.

The FBM100 Index fell 2.7% in September 2023. The sell-off, which largely concentrated towards the last week of the month, was rather broad-based, led by Financials and Commodities. While there could be volatility caused by quarter-end rebalancing, investors were spooked by UST yields at a 16-year high and persistent Dollar strength affecting EM markets, in addition to the Fed's hawkish messaging on interest rates. Domestically, there also seems to be a lack of fresh leads and some political noises surrounding cabinet reshuffling.

The FBM100 Index rose 0.1% in October. There were bargain hunting in Financials and Commodities following the steep sell-off in the previous month, while Telcos (mainly mobile operators) were laggards. Within the broader market, Construction performed while Technology, Energy and Property languished. Overall sentiment remains clouded by the surge in UST yields which topped 5% last month and persistent USD strength affecting EM markets, coupled with tensions in the Middle East.

The FBM100 Index rose 0.9% in November 2023. Investors bought into Utilities, Telcos, Commodities (mainly plantations) and Gaming, took profit on Financials following the previous month's run-up as well as hard commodities. We also saw interest in Consumer names. Within the broader market, Technology and Healthcare did well, while Energy languished on the back of lower oil prices. Overall sentiment was lifted by expectations that the Fed may be done with rate hikes given the cooling inflation and recent economic data out of the US. The pullback in UST yields and the weaker dollar lifted interest in EM markets.

The FBM100 Index rose 0.9% December 2023. Investors rejoiced at Fed's decision to hold rates and signalling the end of hikes given the cooling inflation data and recent economic data out of the US, coupled with the weaker USD and falling treasury yields, they were quick to lock in gains when the index rose to 1,470 points and ahead of the year-end holidays. Financials, Utilities, Healthcare and select Telcos saw gains, while select commodities and Consumer-related names were sold off. FBM30 saw the inclusion of YTL Corporation and YTL Power and removal of Dialog Group ("DLG") and Westports Holdings Bhd ("WPRTS"). Within the broader market, Technology and Gloves did well, the latter spurred by recent surge in Coronavirus Disease 2019 ("COVID-19") cases.

Fixed Income

During the financial period under review, in the month of May 2023, the Central Bank's Monetary Policy Committee ("MPC") increased the Overnight Policy Rate ("OPR") by 25 bps as they judged that it was timely to further normalise the degree of monetary accommodation and to ensure the stance of the monetary policy would prevent future risks of financial imbalances. There were no further changes made up until the end of the financial period under review. At the end of the financial period under review, the OPR was at 3.00%. At its last meeting of the year in November 2023, the Central Bank said it will ensure the monetary policy stance remains conducive to sustain economic growth amid price stability.

The Consumer Price Index ("CPI") continued to decelerate to 3.7% in January 2023 after being in a deceleration pace from the last few months of 2022. It continued to remain at 3.7% in the month of February 2023. In the month of March 2023, it eased further to 3.4% and 3.3% in the month of April 2023. Continuing its easing pace, inflation in the month of May 2023 was at 2.8% whilst June 2023 recorded a slower pace of 2.4%. In July 2023, it slowed down further to 2% year-on-year ("y-o-y"), amid a slower increase in the costs of restaurants, hotels and food & non-alcoholic beverages.

It continued to remain at 2% in August 2023 and inched lower to 1.9% in September 2023. In October 2023, it continued to moderate lower to 1.8% and then to 1.5% in November 2023. It continued to remain at 1.5% in the month of December 2023.

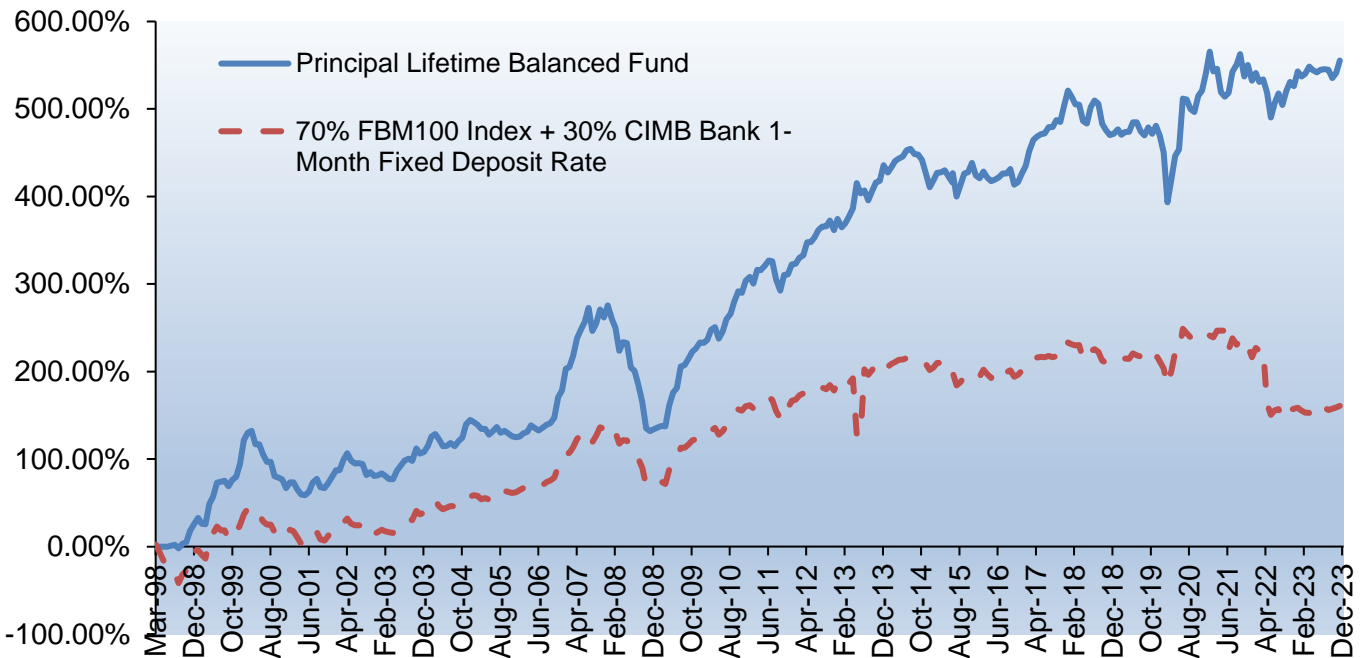
In 2023, the full year fixed income foreign flows totaled RM23.6 billion which was a marked improvement from the outflow of RM9.8 billion we saw in 2022. Total foreign holdings stood at RM270.4 billion at the end of December 2023 whilst holdings peaked at RM279.2 billion in July 2023. As a share of total outstanding, foreign holdings were lower at 34.4% for Malaysia Government Securities ("MGS"), 9.6% for Government Investment Issues ("GII") and 22.7% for MGS + GII whilst Private Debt Securities ("PDS") was at 1.6%.

For year-to-date ("YTD") December 2023, the Bond Pricing Agency Malaysia Sdn Bhd ("BPAM") Corporates All Bond (7 years-over) Index was the best performer recording a return of +10.54%. Meanwhile, the Quantshop MGS Short Index continued to be the worst performer for the year with returns of +3.76%. In 2023, both the MGS and GII fell between 19 to 35 bps points across the curve amid the rising interest rate cycle due to persistent inflation. The 3-year, 5-year, 7-year, 10-year, 15-year, 20-year and 30-year benchmarks closed at 3.53%, 3.65%, 3.74%, 3.73%, 3.99%, 4.11% and 4.25% respectively at the end of December 2023.

Asset allocation into equities increased from 53.57% as at 31 December 2022 to 65.30% as at 31 December 2023. Allocation to fixed income decreased from 37.77% to 30.82% during the same period, which reflects our more positive view on equity markets.

MARKET OUTLOOK***Equity**

Malaysia's Purchasing Managers' Index ("PMI") was unchanged at 47.9 points in December 2023. According to S&P Global, Malaysian manufacturers continue to endure weak demand conditions, albeit the moderation of new orders was the softest since August 2023. Also, firms hired for the first time in eight months while input prices eased. Manufacturers remain optimistic of demand conditions over the course of the next 12 months. The latest PMI suggests that GDP growth is running at similar level to that seen in second quarter of 2023 and third quarter of 2023 of 2.9% and 3.3% year-on-year ("y-o-y") respectively. To recap, BNM projects GDP to grow 4% in 2023 and 4-5% in 2024.

BNM maintained OPR at 3.00% in November's MPC. We expect no rate hikes for 2024 given muted inflation and modest economic growth. Inflation eased further to 1.5% in November, significantly undershooting BNM's revised target of 2.5-3.0% for 2023. Given the low base, there appears to be sufficient headroom to central bank's 2.1-3.6% CPI forecast for 2024 with the impending cut back in subsidies.

Fixed Income

In October 2023, the Prime Minister announced its largest ever budget of RM394 billion for 2024 which was 2% higher than the previous year's RM386 billion. Budget 2024 demonstrates policy continuity and much needed fiscal reforms. The government maintains its gradual fiscal consolidation path, with the fiscal deficit improving from a projected 5% in 2023 to 4.3% in 2024. It sets out a series of targets to be met within 3 to 5 years which include achieving a fiscal deficit of 3% of GDP by 2026 and capping Federal debt and Government Guarantees at 60% and 25% of GDP respectively.

The Central Bank in its latest monetary policy statement projects Malaysia's GDP growth to improve in 2024, on the back of a recovery in exports as well as resilient domestic expenditure. They expect continued employment and wage growth to remain supportive of household spending. However, growth outlook remains subject to downside risks, mainly due to geopolitical tensions, inflation outturns and heightened volatility in global financial markets.

Focus in 2024 would be on fiscal reformation implementation which includes the recent announcement on sales tax on low value goods starting 1 January 2024, 2% hike in service tax from March 2024 and higher electricity tariffs for targeted users among others. This is expected to keep inflation levels elevated. There is also focus on targeted petrol subsidy which is expected to take place in 2024. To implement the targeted petrol subsidy plan, the government has developed a central database hub called Pangkalan Data Utama ("PADU"), which will be used to determine the eligibility of a person for a targeted fuel subsidy that is premised upon one's net disposable income.

Overall, we remain positive for the domestic bond market as we believe BNM will keep its OPR unchanged for now unless growth and inflationary outlook continue to surprise the market. We believe the local bond market will remain well supported for now with volatility mainly coming from global yield movements.

INVESTMENT STRATEGY

Equity

We remain constructive on sectors that stand to gain from the roadmap National Energy Transition Roadmap (“NETR”), including Utilities, Construction, and Property. Additionally, we are optimistic on selective Technology due to the ongoing structural growth trends in the sector. We have also become more optimistic about selective Financials.

Key risks are the derailment of Malaysia’s macroeconomic recovery and corporate earnings growth due to the larger-than-expected impact of rising inflation, slower global economic growth, and heightened geopolitical risks.

Fixed Income

We continue to prefer corporate bonds driven by the compelling potential for a more favorable total return. We maintain our defensive stance in our credit selections and will opportunistically trade to take profit, when possible, to reinvest in primary issuances.

SOFT COMMISSIONS AND REBATES

Principal Asset Management Berhad (the “Manager”), the sub-manager and the Trustee will not retain any form of rebate or soft commission from, or otherwise share in any commission with, any broker in consideration for directing dealings in the investments of the Principal Malaysia Funds (“Funds”) unless the soft commission received is retained in the form of goods and services such as research and advisory services that assist in the decision making process relating to the Fund’s investments. All dealings with brokers are executed on most favourable terms available for the Fund.

During the financial year under review, the Manager, the sub-manager and the trustee did not receive any rebates from the brokers or dealers but the Manager has retained soft commission in the form of goods and services such as financial wire services and stock quotations system incidental to investment management of the Funds and there was no churning of trades.

SECURITIES FINANCING TRANSACTIONS

The Fund has not undertaken any securities lending or repurchase transactions during the financial year under review.

STATE OF AFFAIR OF THE FUND

In relation to this Fund, the Fund had issued the Replacement Master Prospectus (Conventional Funds) document dated 10 July 2023.

Effective 24 November 2023, the Fund has changed Trustee to HSBC (Malaysia) Trustee Berhad following the issuance of the First Supplemental Master Prospectus (Conventional funds) dated 27 October 2023.

We are of view that the changes above do not affect the existing unit holder to stay invested in the Fund and it is not a significant change. Unit holders may refer to Appendix 1 for the detailed list of changes.

There were no other significant changes in the state of affairs of the Fund during the financial year and up to the date of Manager’s report, not otherwise disclosed in the financial statements.

CIRCUMSTANCES THAT MATERIALLY AFFECT ANY INTEREST OF UNIT HOLDERS

There were no circumstances that had materially affected the interest of the unit holders during the financial year under review.

CROSS TRADE

No cross-trade transactions have been carried out during the financial year under review.

UNIT SPLIT

No unit split exercise has been carried out during the financial year under review.

**NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2023****1. THE FUND, THE MANAGER, AND ITS PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES**

Principal Lifetime Balanced Fund (the “Fund”) is governed by a Principal Master Deed dated 15 May 2008, an Eighth Supplemental Master Deed dated 14 June 2010, a Thirteenth Supplemental Master Deed dated 26 June 2012, an Eighteenth Supplemental Master Deed dated 25 March 2015, a Twentieth Supplemental Master Deed dated 21 October 2019, Twenty Third Supplemental Master Deed dated 27 June 2022, Twenty Fourth Supplemental Master Deed dated 13 January 2023 (the “Previous Trustee”) and a Twenty Fifth Supplemental Master Deed dated 26 May 2023 (collectively referred to as the “Deeds”) between the Manager and HSBC (Malaysia) Trustee Berhad (the “Trustee”).

The Fund aims to invest in a diversified portfolio of equities and fixed income investments. In line with its objective, the investment policy and strategy will be to maintain a balanced portfolio between equities and fixed income investments in the ratio of 70:30. The fixed income portion of the Fund is to provide some capital stability to the Fund whilst the equity portion will provide the added return in a rising market. The investments by the Fund in equity securities shall be between 50% to 70% (both inclusive) of its NAV and investments in fixed income securities and liquid assets shall not be less than 30% of its NAV with a minimum credit rating of “BBB3” or “P2” by RAM or equivalent rating by MARC or by local rating agency(ies) of the country of issuance or “BBB-” by S&P or equivalent rating by any other international rating agencies. The Fund may invest up to 40% of its NAV in Unrated Fixed Income Securities. The Fund may opt to seek investment exposure via collective investment scheme that is in line with the Fund’s objective, subject to the requirement of the GUTF. With effect from 10 July 2023, the Fund may invest up to 25% of its NAV in any Eligible Market globally with some operations or businesses in Malaysia to capture growth opportunities.

All investments are subjected to the GUTF, SC requirements, the Deeds, except where exemptions or variations have been approved by the SC, internal policies and procedures and the Fund’s objective.

The Fund has issued the Replacement Master Prospectus (Conventional funds) dated 10 July 2023 and First Supplemental Master Prospectus (Conventional funds) dated 27 October 2023.

The Manager, is a joint venture between Principal Financial Group®, a member of the FORTUNE 500® and a Nasdaq-listed global financial services and CIMB Group Holdings Berhad, one of Southeast Asia’s leading universal banking groups. The principal activities of the Manager are the establishment and management of unit trust funds and fund management activities.

2. MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies have been used consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the financial statements:

(a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the MFRS as issued by the Malaysian Accounting Standards Board (“MASB”) and IFRS as issued by the International Accounting Standards Board (“IASB”).

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by financial assets at fair value through profit or loss.

2. MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)**(a) Basis of preparation (continued)**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with MFRS and IFRS requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reported year.

It also requires the Manager to exercise their judgement in the process of applying the Fund's accounting policies. Although these estimates and assumptions are based on the Manager's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results may differ.

The areas involving a higher degree of judgement or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements are disclosed in Note 2(l).

There are no other standards, amendments to standards or interpretations that are effective for the financial year beginning on 1 January 2023 that have a material effect on the financial statements of the Fund.

None of the standards, amendments to standards or interpretations that are effective for the financial year beginning on/after 1 January 2024 are applicable to the Fund.

(b) Financial assets and financial liabilities**Classification**

The Fund classifies its financial assets in the following measurement categories:

- those to be measured subsequently at fair value through profit or loss, and
- those to be measured at amortised cost.

The Fund classifies its investments based on both the Fund's business model for managing those financial assets and the contractual cash flow characteristics of the financial assets. The portfolio of financial assets is managed and performance is evaluated on a fair value basis. The Fund is primarily focused on fair value information and uses that information to assess the assets' performance and to make decisions. The Fund has not taken the option to irrevocably designate any equity securities as fair value through other comprehensive income ("OCI").

The contractual cash flows of the Fund's debt securities are solely payments of principal and interest ("SPPI"). However, these securities are neither held for the purpose of collecting contractual cash flows nor held both for collecting contractual cash flows and for sale. The collection of contractual cash flows is only incidental to achieving the Fund's business model's objective. Consequently, all investments are measured at fair value through profit or loss.

The Fund classifies cash and cash equivalents, amount due from stockbrokers, amount due from Manager and dividends receivable as financial assets at amortised cost as these financial assets are held to collect contractual cash flows consisting of the amount outstanding.

All of the Fund's financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost.

2. MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)**(b) Financial assets and financial liabilities (continued)**Recognition and measurement

Regular purchases and sales of financial assets are recognised on the trade-date, the date on which the Fund commits to purchase or sell the asset. Investments are initially recognised at fair value. Transaction costs are expensed in the statement of comprehensive income.

Financial instruments are recognised in the statement of financial position when, and only when, the Fund becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument.

Financial assets are derecognised when the rights to receive cash flows from the investments have expired or have been transferred and the Fund has transferred substantially all risks and rewards of ownership.

Financial liabilities are derecognised when it is extinguished, i.e. when the obligation specified in the contract is discharged or cancelled or expired.

Unrealised gains or losses arising from changes in the fair value of the financial assets at fair value through profit or loss are presented in the statement of comprehensive income within net gain or loss on financial assets at fair value through profit or loss in the financial year which they arise.

Dividend income from financial assets at fair value through profit or loss is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income as part of gross dividend income when the Fund's right to receive payments is established.

Quoted securities in Malaysia are valued at the last traded price quoted on Bursa Malaysia Securities Bhd ("Bursa Securities") at the date of the statement of financial position.

If a valuation based on the market price does not represent the fair value of the quoted securities, for example during abnormal market conditions or when no market price is available, including in the event of a suspension in the quotation of the quoted securities for a period exceeding 14 days, or such shorter period as agreed by the Trustee, then the quoted securities are valued as determined in good faith by the Manager, based on the methods or bases approved by the Trustee after appropriate technical consultation.

Unquoted fixed income securities denominated in MYR/RM are revalued on a daily basis based on fair value prices quoted by a Bond Pricing Agency ("BPA") registered with the SC as per the GUTF. Refer to Note 2(l) for further explanation.

Deposits with licensed financial institutions are stated at cost plus accrued interest calculated on the effective interest method over the financial year from the date of placement to the date of maturity of the respective deposits.

Financial assets at amortised cost and other financial liabilities are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2. MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)**(b) Financial assets and financial liabilities (continued)**Impairment for assets carried at amortised costs

The Fund measures credit risk and expected credit loss (“ECL”) using probability of default, exposure at default and loss given default. The Manager consider both historical analysis and forward looking information in determining any ECL. The Manager consider the probability of default to be close to zero as these instruments have a low risk of default and the counterparties have a strong capacity to meet their contractual obligations in the near term. As a result, no loss allowance has been recognised based on 12 month ECL as any such impairment would be wholly insignificant to the Fund.

Significant increase in credit risk

A significant increase in credit risk is defined by the Manager as any contractual payment which is more than 30 days past due.

Definition of default and credit-impaired financial assets

Any contractual payment which is more than 90 days past due is considered credit impaired.

Write-off

The Fund writes off financial assets, in whole or in part, when it has exhausted all practical recovery efforts and has concluded there is no reasonable expectation of recovery. The assessment of no reasonable expectation of recovery is based on unavailability of debtor’s sources of income or assets to generate sufficient future cash flows to repay the amount. The Fund may write-off financial assets that are still subject to enforcement activity. Subsequent recoveries of amounts previously written off will result in impairment gains. There are no write-offs/recoveries during the financial year.

(c) Income recognition

Dividend income is recognised on the ex-dividend date when the right to receive payment is established.

Interest income from deposits with licensed financial institutions and unquoted fixed income securities are recognised on a time proportionate basis using the effective interest rate method on an accrual basis.

Interest income is calculated by applying the effective interest rate to the gross carrying amount of a financial asset except for financial assets that subsequently become credit-impaired. For credit-impaired financial assets the effective interest rate is applied to the net carrying amount of the financial asset (after deduction of the loss allowance).

Realised gain or loss on disposal of quoted securities is accounted for as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of quoted securities, determined on a weighted average cost basis.

Realised gain or loss on disposal of unquoted fixed income securities is accounted for as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of investments, determined on cost adjusted for accretion of discount or amortisation of premium.

2. MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)**(d) Functional and presentation currency**

Items included in the financial statements of the Fund are measured using the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Fund operates (the “functional currency”). The financial statements are presented in MYR, which is the Fund’s functional and presentation currency.

(e) Cash and cash equivalents

For the purpose of statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents comprise bank balance and deposits with licensed financial institutions with original maturities of three months or less that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

(f) Taxation

Current tax expense is determined according to Malaysian tax laws at the current rate based upon the taxable profit earned during the financial year.

Withholding taxes on investment income from investment are based on tax regime of the respective countries that the Fund invests in. They are presented within other expenses line in the statement of comprehensive income.

(g) Distribution

A distribution to the Fund’s unit holders is accounted for as a deduction from realised reserve. A proposed distribution is recognised as a liability in the financial year in which it is approved by the Trustee.

(h) Transaction costs

Transaction costs are costs incurred to acquire or dispose financial assets or liabilities at fair value through profit or loss. They include fees and commissions paid to agents, advisers, brokers and dealers. Transaction costs, when incurred, are immediately recognised in the statement of comprehensive income as expenses.

(i) Amount due from/to stockbrokers

Amounts due from and amount due to stockbrokers represent receivables for quoted securities and unquoted fixed income securities sold and payables for quoted securities and unquoted fixed income securities purchased that have been contracted for but not yet settled or delivered on the statement of financial position date respectively.

(j) Unit holders’ contributions

The unit holders’ contributions to the Fund meet the criteria to be classified as equity instruments under MFRS 132 “Financial Instruments: Presentation”. Those criteria include:

- the units entitle the holder to a proportionate share of the Fund’s NAV;
- the units are the most subordinated class and class features are identical;
- there is no contractual obligations to deliver cash or another financial asset other than the obligation on the Fund to repurchase; and
- the total expected cash flows from the units over its life are based substantially on the profit or loss of the Fund.

2. MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

(j) Unit holders' contributions (continued)

The outstanding units are carried at the redemption amount that is payable at each financial year if unit holder exercises the right to put the unit back to the Fund.

Units are created and cancelled at prices based on the Fund's NAV per unit at the time of creation or cancellation. The Fund's NAV per unit is calculated by dividing the net assets attributable to unit holders with the total number of outstanding units.

(k) Realised and unrealised portions of profit or loss after tax

The analysis of realised and unrealised portions of profit or loss after tax as presented on the statement of comprehensive income is prepared in accordance with GUTF.

(l) Critical accounting estimates and judgements in applying accounting policies

The Fund makes estimates and assumptions concerning the future. The resulting accounting estimates will, by definition, rarely equal the related actual results. To enhance the information content of the estimates, certain key variables that are anticipated to have material impact to the Fund's results and financial position are tested for sensitivity to changes in the underlying parameters.

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated by the Manager and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

Estimate of fair value of unquoted fixed income securities

In undertaking any of the Fund's investment, the Manager will ensure that all assets of the Fund under management will be valued appropriately, that is at fair value and in compliance with the GUTF.

MYR/RM-denominated unquoted fixed income securities are valued using fair value prices quoted by a BPA. Where the Manager is of the view that the price quoted by BPA for a specific unquoted fixed income securities differs from the market price by more than 20 bps, the Manager may use market price, provided that the Manager records its basis for using a non-BPA price, obtains necessary internal approvals to use the non-BPA price, and keeps an audit trail of all decisions and basis for adopting the use of non-BPA price.

The investment objective of the Fund is to grow the value of investments over the long-term through investment in a diversified mix of Malaysian assets.

The Fund is exposed to a variety of risks which include market risk (inclusive of price risk and interest rate risk), credit risk and liquidity risk.

Financial risk management is carried out through internal control process adopted by the Manager and adherence to the investment restrictions as stipulated in the Deeds and GUTF.

(a) Market risk

(i) Price risk

This is the risk that the fair value of an investment in quoted securities and unquoted fixed income securities will fluctuate because of changes in market prices (other than those arising from interest rate risk). The value of investment in quoted securities and unquoted fixed income securities may fluctuate according to the activities of individual companies, sector and overall political and economic conditions. Such fluctuation may cause the Fund's NAV and prices of units to fall as well as rise, and income produced by the Fund may also fluctuate.

The price risk is managed through diversification and selection of quoted securities, unquoted fixed income securities and other financial instruments within specified limits according to the Deeds.

The Fund is exposed to price risk arising from interest rate fluctuation in relation to its investments of RM13,891,995 (2022: RM18,217,244) in unquoted fixed income securities. (ii) Interest rate risk

In general, when interest rates rise, unquoted fixed income securities prices will tend to fall and vice versa. Therefore, the NAV of the Fund may also tend to fall when interest rates rise or are expected to rise. However, investors should be aware that should the Fund holds an unquoted fixed income securities till maturity, such price fluctuations would dissipate as it approaches maturity, and thus the growth of the NAV shall not be affected at maturity. In order to mitigate interest rates exposure of the Fund, the Manager will manage the duration of the portfolio via shorter or longer tenured assets depending on the view of the future interest rate trend of the Manager, which is based on its continuous fundamental research and analysis.

Investors should note that the movement in prices of unquoted fixed income securities and money market instruments are benchmarked against interest rates. As such, the investments are exposed to the movement of the interest rates.

This risk is crucial since unquoted fixed income securities portfolio management depends on forecasting interest rate movements. Prices of unquoted fixed income securities move inversely to interest rate movements, therefore as interest rates rise, the prices of unquoted fixed income securities decrease and vice versa. Furthermore, unquoted fixed income securities with longer maturity and lower yield coupon rates are more susceptible to interest rate movements.

Such investments may be subject to unanticipated rise in interest rates which may impair the ability of the issuers to meet the obligation under the instrument, especially if the issuers are highly leveraged. An increase in interest rates may therefore increase the potential for default by an issuer.

The table below summarises the sensitivity of the Fund's profit or loss and NAV to movements in prices of unquoted fixed income securities held by the Fund as a result of movement in interest rate. The analysis is based on the assumptions that the interest rate changed by 1% with all other variables held constant. This represents management's best estimate of a reasonable possible shift in the interest rate, having regard to the historical volatility of the interest rate.

(b) Credit risk

Credit risk refers to the risk that a counter party will default on its contractual obligation resulting in financial loss to the Fund.

Investment in unquoted fixed income securities may involve a certain degree of credit/default risk with regards to the issuers. Generally, credit risk or default risk is the risk of loss due to the issuer's non-payment or untimely payment of the investment amount as well as the returns on investment. This will cause a decline in value of the defaulted unquoted fixed income securities and subsequently depress the NAV of the Fund. Usually credit risk is more apparent for an investment with a longer tenure, i.e. the longer the duration, the higher the credit risk. Credit risk can be managed by performing continuous fundamental credit research and analysis to ascertain the creditworthiness of its issuer.

In addition, the Manager imposes a minimum rating requirement as rated by either local and/or foreign rating agencies and manages the duration of the investment in accordance with the objective of the Fund. For this Fund, the unquoted fixed income securities must satisfy a minimum rating requirement of at least a "BBB3" or "P2" by RAM or equivalent rating by MARC or by local rating agency(ies) of the country of issuance or "BBB-" by S&P or equivalent rating by any other international rating agencies.

The credit risk arising from placements of deposits in licensed financial institutions is managed by ensuring that the Fund will only place deposits in reputable licensed financial institutions.

For the amount due from Manager, the settlement terms of the proceeds from the creation of units receivable from the Manager are governed by the GUTF.

For amount due from stockbrokers, the settlement terms are governed by the relevant rules and regulations as prescribed by respective stock exchanges. The credit risk is minimal as all transactions in quoted securities are settled/paid upon delivery using approved stockbrokers.

Deposits with licensed financial institutions of the Fund have an average remaining maturity of 1 day (2022: 3 days).

(c) Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Fund will encounter difficulty in meeting its financial obligations.

The Manager manages this risk by maintaining sufficient level of liquid assets to meet anticipated payments and cancellations of the units by unit holders. Liquid assets comprise bank balances and deposits with licensed financial institutions which are capable of being converted into cash within 7 business days. Generally, all investments are subject to a certain degree of liquidity risk depending on the nature of the investment instruments, market, sector and other factors. For the purpose of the Fund, the Manager will attempt to balance the entire portfolio by investing in a mix of assets with satisfactory trading volume and those that occasionally could encounter poor liquidity. This is expected to reduce the risks for the entire portfolio without limiting the Fund's growth potentials.

(d) Capital risk management

The capital of the Fund is net assets attributable to unit holders of RM45,079,619 (2022: RM48,236,949). The amount of capital can change significantly on a daily basis as the Fund is subject to daily subscriptions and redemptions at the discretion of unit holders. The Fund's objective when managing capital is to safeguard the Fund's ability to continue as a going concern in order to provide returns to unit holders and benefits for other stakeholders and to maintain a strong capital base to support the development of the investment activities of the Fund.

(e) Fair value estimation

Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (i.e. an exit price).

The fair values of financial assets traded in active markets (such as trading securities) are based on quoted market prices at the close of trading on the financial year end date. The Fund utilises the last traded market price for financial assets where the last traded market price falls within the bid-ask spread. In circumstances where the last traded market price is not within the bid-ask spread, the Manager will determine the point within the bid-ask spread that is most representative of the fair value.

An active market is a market in which transactions for the asset or liability take place with sufficient frequency and volume to provide pricing information on an ongoing basis.

The fair value of financial assets that are not traded in an active market is determined by using valuation techniques.

(i) Fair value hierarchy

The table below analyses financial instruments carried at fair value. The different levels have been defined as follows:

- Quoted prices (unadjusted) in active market for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1)
- Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly (that is, as prices) or indirectly (that is, derived from prices) (Level 2)
- Inputs for the asset and liability that are not based on observable market data (that is, unobservable inputs) (Level 3)

The level in the fair value hierarchy within which the fair value measurement is categorised in its entirety is determined on the basis of the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement in its entirety. For this purpose, the significance of an input is assessed against the fair value measurement in its entirety.

If a fair value measurement uses observable inputs that require significant adjustment based on unobservable inputs, that measurement is a Level 3 measurement.

Assessing the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement in its entirety requires judgement, considering factors specific to the asset or liability.

The determination of what constitutes 'observable' requires significant judgement by the Fund. The Fund considers observable data to be that market data that is readily available, regularly distributed or updated, reliable and verifiable, not proprietary, and provided by independent sources that are actively involved in the relevant market.

4. MANAGEMENT FEE

In accordance with the Deeds, the Manager is entitled to a maximum management fee of 1.85% per annum, calculated daily based on the NAV of the Fund.

For the financial year ended 31 December 2023, the management fee is recognised at a rate of 1.85% per annum (2022: 1.85% per annum).

There is no further liability to the Manager in respect of management fee other than the amount recognised above.

5. TRUSTEE FEE

In accordance with the Deeds, the Trustee is entitled to a maximum Trustee fee of 0.08% per annum, calculated daily based on the NAV of the Fund. The Trustee fee includes the local custodian fee but excludes the foreign sub-custodian fee (if any).

For the financial year ended 1 October 2022 until 31 July 2023, the Trustee fee is recognised at a rate of 0.08%. Effective 1 August 2023, Trustee Fee is recognised at the rate of 0.045% per annum (2022: 0.08% per annum).

There is no further liability to the Trustee in respect of Trustee fee other than the amount recognised above.
